Iowa DOT State Recreational Trails Grant	Establish recreational trails throughout Iowa. The program is restricted to the acquisition, construction or improvement of recreational trails open for public use or trails which will be dedicated public use upon completion. This grant is very competitive, so MIPA is interested in major projects, especially those that connect one trail to another or connect two communities or destinations (Eligible: local governments and certain nonprofits). IDOT RISE Grant – Immediate Opportunity	RISE funds roadway improvements to facilitate economic development projects, such as expanding businesses, industrial/commerce parks, etc. Immediate opportunity relates to an immediate, nonspeculative opportunity for permanent job creation or retention. Up to \$12,000 per RISE eligible job created or maintained may be awarded up to 80% of the RISE eligible costs. Applications are accepted any time. (Eligible: local governments)	Ongoing

FUNDING: Federal Home Loan Bank Provides Housing Grant Funds

Now is the best time to begin preparing your 2023 Competitive Affordable Housing Program (AHP) application. FHLB Des Moines has increased the grant request limit to \$1,000,000 per project and a maximum subsidy of \$50,000 per unit. The program funds projects of local governments, non-profit, and for-profit developers. If your community has a possible housing project, this program is worth exploring.

FUNDING: EDA Public Works Grant

This open grant (no set deadline) is designed for major economic development and industrial projects. The Public Works grants fund infrastructure to support economic opportunities. The Economic Development Administration's (EDA) supports development in economically distressed areas of the United States by fostering job creation and attracting private investment. Under this NOFO, EDA solicits applications from applicants in order to provide investments that support construction, non-construction, planning, technical assistance, and revolving loan fund projects under EDA's Public Works program. Grants and cooperative agreements are designed to leverage existing regional assets and support the implementation of economic development strategies that advance new ideas and creative approaches to advance economic prosperity in distressed communities, including those negatively impacted by changes to the coal economy and nuclear power plant closures.
